CITY OF BELLEVUE CIVIL EMERGENCY ORDER IMPOSING CURFEW

WHEREAS, in my capacity as Mayor of the City of Bellevue, I proclaimed a civil emergency exists in the City of Bellevue in a Proclamation of Civil Emergency dated May 31 2020; and

WHEREAS, the facts stated in my Proclamation of Civil Emergency still exist as this Order is being issued; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to use extraordinary measures to protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the civil emergency necessitates the utilization of emergency powers granted to the Mayor pursuant to Bellevue City Code, Chapter 9.22 and RCW 38.52, including the power to enact a general curfew as set forth in Bellevue City Code, Chapter 9.22.020.A.

WHEREAS, a curfew is necessary to ensure public safety and to protect property.

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned Mayor of the City of Bellevue, Washington hereby orders:

- 1. A general curfew is imposed in the City of Bellevue commencing at 5:00 pm on May 31 2020. No person shall enter or remain in the public right-of-way, or in the public parks, or at any other public place as bounded approximately on the West by 100th Ave NE, on the South by Main St/SE 1st St, on the East by 120th Ave NE/NE 1st St and on the North by NE 12th St. The general Curfew shall continue until 5:00 a.m. on June 1, 2020, and shall be enforced by the Bellevue Police Department, other law enforcement agencies and the military.
- 2. The general curfew shall not apply to law enforcement personnel who are actively engaged in carrying out their duties; military personnel who are actively engaged in providing assistance to the City pursuant to the Proclamation of the Mayor; emergency personnel and other City and government personnel who are actively engaged in carrying out their duties; City and governmental officials with valid identification; representatives of the media authorized in advance by the City Manager's Office or the Chief of the Bellevue Police Department or his designee. For purposes of this Order, the phrase "actively engaged in carrying out their duties" includes traveling to and from the location of those duties to begin or end a work shift.
- 3. Any person found to have knowingly violated this Civil Emergency Order is guilty of Failure to Obey the Mayor's Emergency Order, and upon conviction may be punished

by a fine of not more than \$250.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both such fine and imprisonment. BCC 9.22.040.

4. This Civil Emergency Order shall, at the earliest practicable time, be presented to the City Council for ratification and confirmation, and if not so ratified and confirmed shall be void.
