



GLOSSARY

Food chain: It is a sequence of organisms through which nutrients and energy pass as one or-ganism eats another. In a food chain, each organism occupies a different trophic level, defined by how many energy transfers separate it from the basic input of the chain.

Primary Producers: Include plants, lichens, moss, bacteria and algae.

Primary consumers: Herbivores that feed on plants.

Herbivores: Animals that feed only on plants

Secondary consumers: Carnivores that prey on other animals.

Carnivores: Animals that diets consist primarily on meat.

Omnivores: Animals that will consume both meat and plants.

Tertiary consumer: A carnivore at the topmost level in a food chain that feeds on other carnivores.

Apex Predator: Is a predator at the top of a food chain, with no natural predators other than humans.

Decomposers: Are organisms that break down dead plants and animals and other waste. Fun-gi, Bacteria and insects are known as decomposers.
