The Officers were recognized for their exceptional and meritorious conduct during an incident on June 6, 2022. The Officers saved the life of a young individual who was in distress and drowning in Phantom Lake.

But, there are special circumstances that arise where special recognition must be made, and Officers Akahane, Sebers, and Worthington deserve this esteemed honor," said Wendell Shirley, Chief of Police.

BLU: Bellevue Light Rail Unit

Ahead of the grand opening of Sound Transit's 2 Line last April, the Bellevue Police Department (BPD) rolled out its new police unit – The Bellevue Light Rail Unit (BLU). This team is a dedicated unit designed to foster a safe and positive riding experience for individuals and families wishing to use the new Link Light Rail Service through Bellevue.

A Sergeant and four Officers make up this new endeavor, and all five team members will patrol the Link's six Bellevue stops.

Please remember these safety tips:

- 1. Look both ways when crossing the tracks
- 2. Stay alert and put away the smart devices when by a station, and
- 3. Use the crosswalks and don't take a short cut

Between the BLU and partnership with Sound Transit and the King County Sheriff's Office, this effort is a win-win for everyone.


More than 1,000 locks have been handed out, but the Department has no plans to stop anytime soon. Check out the "Community Events" section to learn when the next giveaway will take place.
