(a)	* Consideration of application for Bellevue School District 405 is for a Conditional Use Permit to demolish the present one-story Sammamish High School and to build a new three-story high school facility on the same site. The new academic building will be wrapped around the existing 18,000 square-foot Performing Arts Center which will remain. The site is located at 100 140 th Avenue SE and is in the jurisdiction of the East Bellevue Community Council. File No. 12-117732 LB. Ordinance No. 6100 approving the conditional use permit application of Bellevue School District 405 to demolish the present one-story Sammamish High School and to build a new three-story high school facility on the same site at 100 140 th Avenue SE; File No. 12-117732-LB; and establishing an effective date. <i>(Council discussed this item on February 4, 2013. The Hearing Examiner recommends Council approval of the rezone subject to conditions.)
