SUBJECT: President's Volunteer Service Awards

The City of Bellevue has a long history of volunteer service. In 2012, 6,355 people volunteered in 56 distinct programs for 12 City departments. These volunteers served a total of 144,091 hours with an estimated value of \$3,352,577. In light of their excellent and ongoing service, the City is recognizing 102 individuals with the President's Volunteer Service Award, a national honor offered in recognition of volunteer service.

This year, we are honoring volunteers from nine City programs from the departments of Planning & Community Development, Fire, Finance and Parks & Community Services. The programs include Economic Development (Tom Boydell nominator), Neighborhood Mediation (Cheryl Cohen nominator), Fire Department (Troy Donlin and Nuri Thobari nominators), the Tax Division (Richard D'Hondt nominator), Bellevue Youth Link (Patrick Alina nominator), Highland Community Center (Kim Indurkar nominator), Kelsey Creek Farm (Pam Myers nominator), Natural Resources (Alex DySard nominator), and Bellevue Botanical Garden (Lisa Scott nominator). Of the 102 honorees, 70 come from the Botanical Garden.

President's Call to Service Award

The President's Call to Service Award is the highest level of recognition. To qualify, a volunteer must have served over 4,000 hours over his or her lifetime. This year there are three awardees, all of whom will be recognized before Council.

- Shirley Johnson has worked as a volunteer at the Highland Community Center for 20 years and has served 4,400 hours. She was nominated by Kim Indurkar.
- Steve Walker has served over 12,000 hours for the Natural Resources Division in the past 24 years. He was nominated by Alex DySard.
- Dallas Graham has served 4,802 hours at the Bellevue Botanical Garden, including the popular Garden D'Lights program. Dallas and his wife Sharon were recognized as the City's Volunteers of the Year in 2010. Dallas was nominated by Lisa Scott.

Gold Awards

With the exception of the President's Call to Service Award, the Gold award is the highest level of recognition. Last year five volunteers earned the Gold Award. This year there are fourteen, including six teens (ages 14-17):

- Hailey Swearingen (teen) worked 148 hours for the Fire Department *Public Information Office*.

Silver Awards

The ten Honorees receiving the Silver Award include Polly Kang and Leno Miao from *Economic Development* (Planning & Community Development Department) and Parks and Community Services Volunteers Kaur Bhutani from *Natural Resources*; Remy Durbin (teen) and Kacie Rumens (teen) from *Kelsey Creek Farm*; and Diane Buck, Jackie Foushee, Carol Todd, Roy Kaesemeyer and Janet Wyman from the *Bellevue Botanical Garden*.

Bronze Awards

Seventy-five volunteers earned the Bronze Award in 2012.
