What is a Land Use Code Amendment (LUCA)?

The Land Use Code is a permitting tool that governs the location, design and approval process for development in the city. A LUCA will add regulations to the code to determine how and where a homeless shelter can be sited in Bellevue. The City Council has set a goal of developing a permanent citywide shelter LUCA for adoption by the August recess.

How can I participate in the discussion?

Councilmembers are encouraging broad outreach to the community. Residents will have a wide range of opportunities to provide feedback: citywide survey in March, workshop sessions in April, City Council oral communications, and a public hearing.
